Nirsevimab (Beyfortus) in Peel Region

- Peel Public Health: will offer Beyfortus® all infants born in 2024 who reside in Peel AND do not have a primary care provider and/or face barriers accessing the vaccine (e.g. newcomers including refugees/asylum seekers), including infants born outside of a hospital, i.e. home births attended by Registered Midwives
 - Infants 6 months and older on the day of their clinic visit are also eligible to receive a
 COVID-19 and influenza vaccines at the same appointment

- Wellfort Community Health Services: will screen and offer Beyfortus® to unattached infants (i.e., those without primary care provider)
